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
out today, deciding to take this passion of mine to the next level and unveil my vision to the rest of you is a *testament* of faith.



I'm reading through The Journals of Lewis and Clark and am stricken by their unique qualifications, tenacity, leadership and curiosity. President Thomas Jefferson noted in a letter to a friend that Lewis' unique attributes qualified him for the expedition: courage, prudence, habits and health, knowledge and experience were among them.

Because he and his partner, Clark, were so right for the job, it's recorded that "From the moment when the expedition left.... discipline was absolutely perfect, in spite of danger, discomfort, alarmingly limited and often unpalatable rations, occasional starvation, cold, wet, exhaustion, and the isolation of a small group seeing far too

much of one another over a long period, usually a dangerous cause of friction. All the factors that undermine morale were present most of the time--and morale remained high."

I am not oblivious to how arduous this journey will be and of what I'm committing to. Like Lewis and Clark, I know there will be hardships ByTheWay. But I am hopeful that my own unique attributes are distinctly right for this adventure. I am prayerful about my areas of lack, inviting personal change and growth and adaptability.

Above all, though, I know that none of that can happen without a strong core. A million times over, thank you! And I hope you enjoy the journey we are about to trek together.

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
